- A devastating fire occurred July 12, 1973 destroying over 16 million military personnel files including:
- 80% of Army records from 11/1/1912 to 1/1/1960
- 75% Air Force records from 9/25/1947 to 1/1/1964
- Navy and Marine records were unaffected

- A date to visit the archives will not be given until all requested files are pulled and available for viewing.
- Cameras & flatbed scanners are permitted. Photocopies can be made for .75 per page.
- All papers must be stamped by staff before leaving.
- No appointment is necessary to view microfilm.
- A research card is required, so bring an I.D.

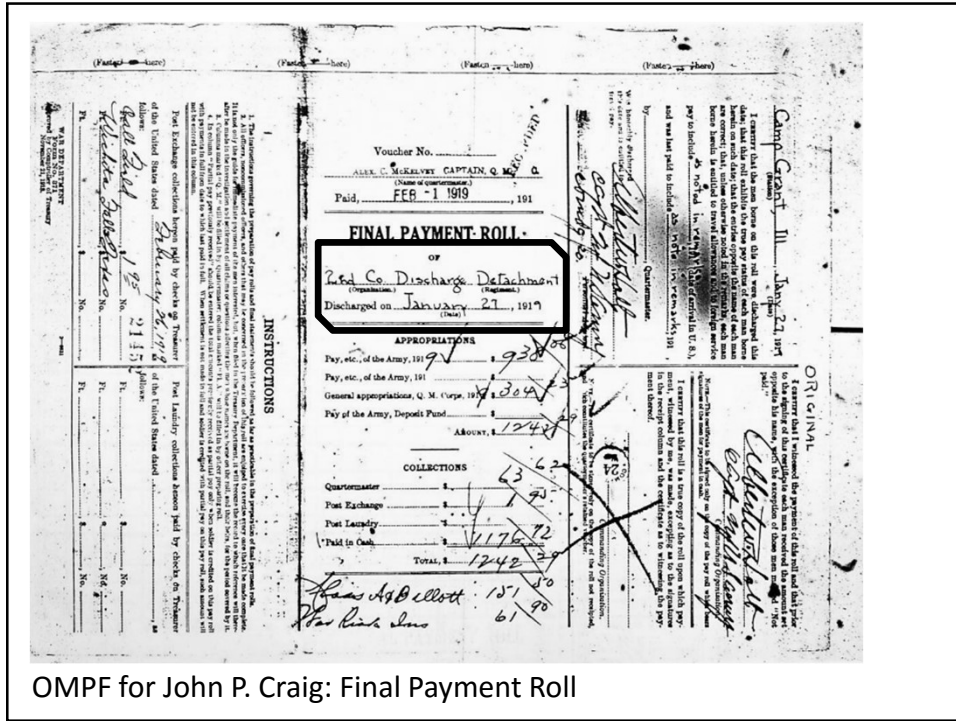

- OMPFs are the official record of a veteran's service with the U.S. Armed Forces.
- Records include military service dates, stations, schooling, transfers, promotions & decorations earned.
- Records of military service concluded before January 1, 1955 are open and can be accessed by the public.
- Requests can be submitted using form 13173.

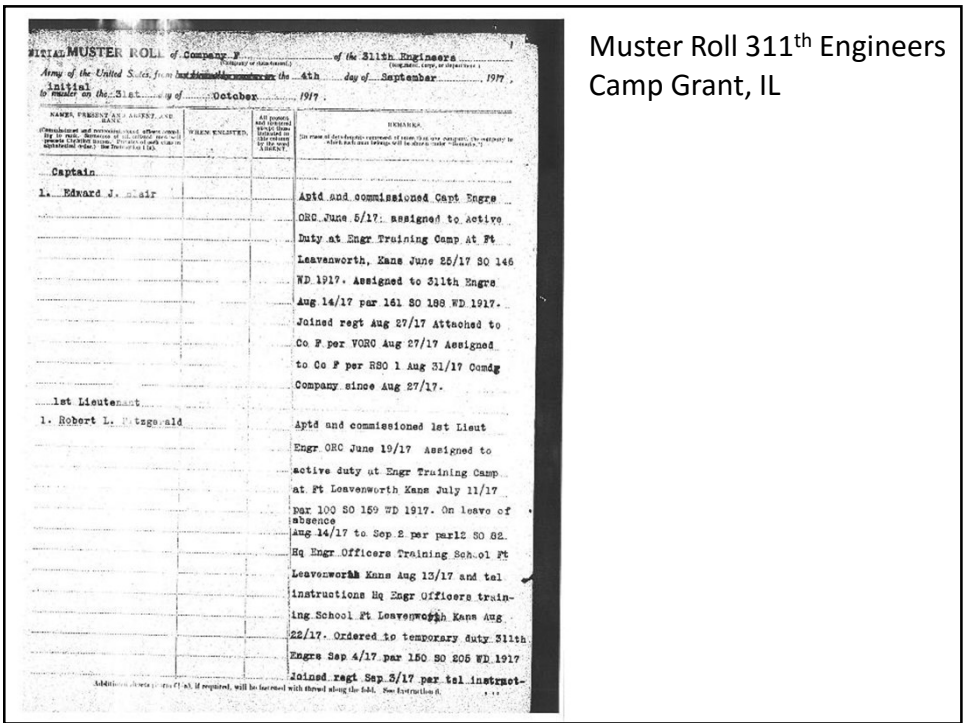
